lan's report

"After all the praise descending on us for the Messiah it is quite a difficult task to give a subjective view from a conductor's angle; I can but agree with our reviewer/correspondents that the performance of the choir reached a quite extraordinary standard – a fitting climax to the weeks of careful preparation and my exploration of a wide range of dynamics and colours.

"To pick out a few memorable moments: 'For unto us...' for its initial lightness, superb runs (even from the basses!) and the fine sonority of 'Wonderful, Counsellor...', matched by the superb playing of the Ensemble, which was quite splendid during the whole evening; 'Surely...' for its intensity and spine-chilling suspensions; 'He trusted in God...' for its naked savagery and a fantastic top C from (most of) the sopranos; 'Hallelujah' for its sheer enthusiasm and brightness; 'Since by man...' – hushed and perfectly in tune! My one reservation concerns the Amen Chorus, the beginning of which dug in its heels and refused to budge! However the energy didn't flag and the pregnant pause before the final utterance was quite electric.

"The soloists – crowned by an exquisite perfor-mance by soprano Laurie Ashworth of truly international standard – comprised a fine and perfectly matched team, each one entering whole-heartedly into the drama of the work.

"There were a few minor imperfections which could have been ironed out with further orchestral rehearsal (e.g. a clash of editions in the duet, not discovered till too late, which almost caused a false start to the following chorus!), but none of sufficient significance to mar the performance as a whole.

"Hearty congratulations to all."

Ideally, please rub out any old markings as soon as possible and make your own annotations in light pencil. (We will be charged for damaged or lost scores).

All borrowed music must be returned at the end of the concert and put into the boxes provided.

Adjudicated Classes 16th-19th March

We intend to enter a group to defend our 2013 title! Some classes have been combined for 2015 so the "Madrigal" class no longer exists, so we will be entering the "Group of Singers" class which requires our own choice of two contrasting songs, with or without accompaniment. We have chosen "The Silver Swan" by Orlando Gibbons and "Quick! We have but a second" by C V Stanford. Volunteers to sing in this group, which will hopefully number not more than 20, should be willing and able to:

- sing in the class on Monday evening,
 16th March
- rehearse most weeks for around 20 minutes after our main rehearsal
- learn the pieces by heart so that we don't need to use copies!

Jean Robinson will be asking for volunteers at the first and second rehearsals with a view to starting to practise the pieces on 20th January.

Choral Celebration Saturday 21st March

This will take place at Stricklandgate Methodist Church, with morning and afternoon sessions. The day will be led by Justin Doyle, a leading young choral conductor, who will give warm-up sessions throughout the day, as well as constructive feedback. We will be singing at this event, and Ian will choose four pieces totalling not more than 20 minutes. Please would you let your Section Rep know if you are unable to sing on that day.
