Newsletter 17 - January 2019

The first rehearsal of the new season is on Tuesday 8th January at 7.30pm at Stricklandgate. Please try to be there in good time to pick up scores.

We are delighted that Geoff Field, our accompanist for the last 18 months, has agreed to be our new Director of Music, and has sent this message:

"Dear Choir Members,

"Having successfully managed to hide from the majority of you behind a piano for a year, I am very honoured to have been asked to appear in front of you as your new director. I am very much looking forward to working with you on our next venture, 'Elijah', and I hope that you will also enjoy all the other music that we are going to sing over the next few years.

"At the first rehearsal I will give out a Rehearsal Schedule for this term. I hope this will help you with your own preparation before rehearsals, as well as knowing what you missed should you happen to be unable to make a rehearsal one week. Just be aware that I might need to revise this after a few weeks, depending on our rate of progress!

"As most members will only know me as a pianist, the Committee has asked if I would include some information for you about my musical life so far. I studied organ, piano, composition and choral conducting at the Royal Academy of Music, gaining an honours degree, the Academy's Recital Diploma for organ, two teaching diplomas and eleven prizes in the five years I was there. As a choral director I have experience of both upper voice and four part choirs. My choirs have won the youth sections of BBC and HTV competitions, been semifinalists in Choir of the Year 2000, made TV and radio appearances, recorded five CDs, sung for the Queen and Prince Philip, performed many of the great choral and orchestral masterpieces, and toured in the UK, Austria, Italy, Sweden, Slovakia and Iceland. As an organist I have given recitals in this country and abroad, and accompanied choirs for TV and radio broadcasts, recordings, and cathedral services. For ten years I

was also Course Director of the Jennifer Bate Organ Academy; an annual residential course for young female organists.

"In 2016 I took early retirement from a 32 year teaching career, during which time I taught at Winchester College, Queenswood, St Mary's, Calne and St Catherine's, Bramley, the latter two being Director of Music posts. As well as teaching KS3, GCSE and A level Music, I also gave (and still teach) individual piano, organ, theory, aural and composition lessons.

"I look forward to welcoming you back next Tuesday.

"Happy New Year!"

But this good news leaves us short of a pianist, and we're pleased that Ken Forster will be our main accompanist this term, with Stephen Hitchcock (former member of our bass section), Andy Plowman and possibly others filling in when Ken isn't available.

Rehearsal CDs will not be provided this term because Elijah is not as complicated as some recent repertoire has been, but there are some excellent recordings that you can listen to on YouTube. There is a Thomas Hampson/Barbara Bonney recording at

All the bills are not yet in but it looks as if the result (before any grants) will be a loss of about £2,600 compared to the budget of £2,420, the difference being mainly reduced ticket sales.
